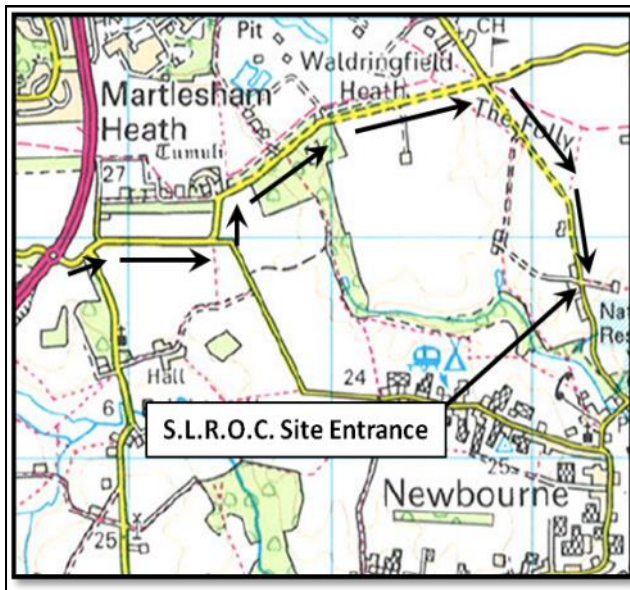

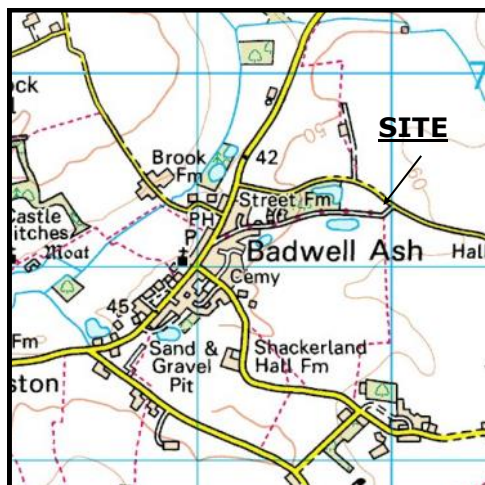


Directions to the Newbourne club site

Project Phoenix



In late September 2016, my then friend had his little 90 up for sale. It had been sitting in a paddock for over a year. He had the best intentions of doing up the 90 with the help of myself and my dad and had spent thousands on parts and some nice gadgets. However, all that went out of the window when the Land Rover developed a knocking noise, so it was stood and never used again.

In the August of 2016, my friend told me he needs to sell his Land Rover as his mum was fed up of it sitting there and doing nothing. I asked how much he wanted

and his response...4.5k... I didn't really want to spend that, nor did I have the money at that time so I offered him 2k... He laughed and said nah! (I won't actually say what he said!) So a month on he came up to me and said take it for 2K; I did say with all parts included (again I won't tell you what he said!) and to be fair we did get most of the parts with my fuel!

In the February of 2017, I started the tedious task of stripping it down, my father had agreed to spray as long as it was a solid 2pak so it was going to be Ferguson grey with jet black roof and then G4 orange. But, when out on a drive in Needham I came across Kerridges and there stood a £47,000 2015 defender 90 adventure edition in phoenix orange.....this took some explaining to my father and all I'd say is he's never sprayed with pearl paint...out comes the iPad and many YouTube videos later!





So now we are in April, Phoenix wasn't in great shape as he needed a lot of panel fettling with aluminium fillers and special zinc primer to hold the corrosion. Once the major dents were pulled out and re-riveted, the 3 coats of filler primer was applied wet and drying between all coats, the base of the orange mid part of the orange and then the final drop coat of the orange was applied and then 3 lacquers... yes 3!

All this was done in a party tent and outside. I have to say my father was brave enough to do this knowing the 5ltrs of orange was around the £200 mark at trade. Also, Movac who supplied us told my father that a gravity gun must be used and, with the gun he suggested, they said this cannot be done.... my father thought otherwise and used the old school suction at £12.99 from Machine Mart. Well the unachievable was achievable in the end.

The intention for the Land Rover was to be a promotional vehicle for 4x4 response but since I got an interesting response, I turned to Suffolk Lowland Search and Rescue. I had my D2 at the time and I helped Neil Marjoram at a few shows and that got me thinking 'hmm search vehicle!' So the decals and stickers, lights and radios were fitted and we did some shows for 2 seasons. But now it's my personal welfare unit along with it being a part of the team for team talks with the public and free advertising for SULSAR, and of course playing with SLROC, Phoenix has helped with a few rescues.

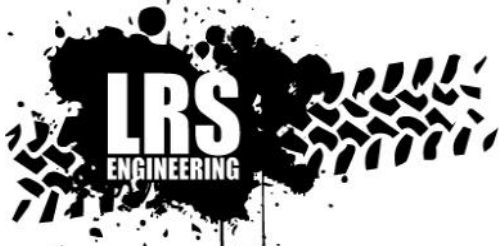

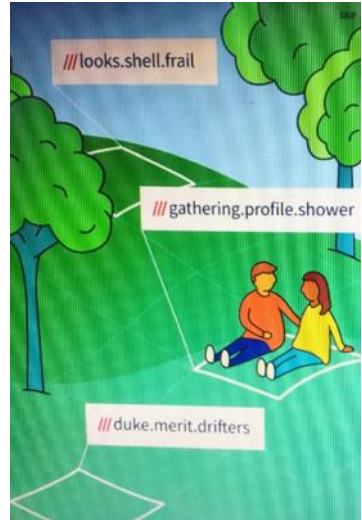


Unsecured.elect.boating

You are now able to download an App to your Smartphone that will accurately identify your location using just three words. Unsecured.elect.boating is the location of our Club House.

We are all aware of latitude and longitude and the Ordnance Survey grid references that are used to identify a location. But for most people these are not widely used. On reporting a problem with a bye way or a footpath I find a postcode is requested on the Council website rather than use the aforementioned. The problem with using a postcode is that it is not accurate enough. It may relate to just five houses but these could be some distance apart (more than 500m). Not very good if you are trying to get to a specific house, particularly in an emergency situation.

In 2013 a group of talented guys set out to overcome a problem they were having with getting equipment delivered to specific places. They came up with an idea which led them to developing a computational process of transforming a physical address description into a specific location on the earth's surface. There are other systems but their system, 'What 3 Words' uses words rather than a long string of numbers to name a location. Each 3 words identifies just one unique location, a square in a 'grid' of 57 trillion squares covering the surface of planet Earth, where each location is just 3 metres by 3 metres square. Your back door is likely to be a different three words (location) than your front door, it is that accurate.

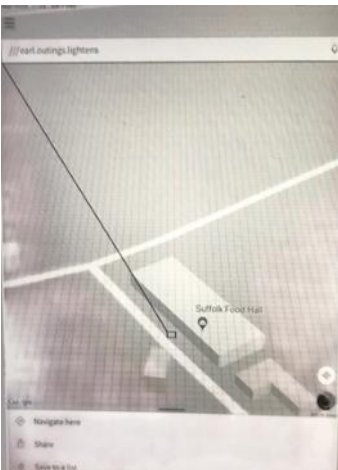


It's not difficult to see just how useful this can be, for identifying where to send help, for sending a parcel, to meet people, etc. In August this year 35 English and Welsh emergency services signed up to use the service. It's a system that is growing quickly as the benefits are quickly recognised. Uber is using it in many countries; Mercedes and Ford are among the car manufacturers that have acquired the rights to use it for future navigation systems. What3Words is compatible with navigation Apps such as Google, Apple and Waze, etc. The App allows you to store favourites, has an interactive map and will help you navigate to any location, which could be where you parked your Land Rover at the airport, which gate to meet friends at a stadium or place on the beach, where to direct emergency services.

The What3Words App is available for free download to your Smartphone.

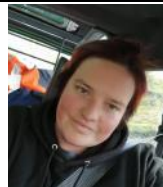

On entering the access lane to the site, please adhere to the **5mph** speed limit. Failure to do so, may result in removal from the site with no refund of fees.

If only watching or socialising, please turn right to park in the rear car park. Do not park in the main car park or proceed to signing-on/scrutineering.

Trailers to be parked in designated area in main parking area.

If taking part in the event please stop at the signing-on hut first:

For insurance purposes, membership cards **must** be available for inspection at **any** club driving event, if requested. Only members holding a full UK driving licence* and who have **signed on**, may drive at any club event. *With the exception of 'Tyro Trials' where Supplementary Regulations may allow drivers of 13 years and upwards.

Then continue to scrutineering: **All** vehicles must be scrutineered prior to driving onto the courses. Minimum requirements for recovery points are two -points at the front with bridle, and manufacturer's tow hitch at the rear or two 'Jates' and bridle. Please fit bridle before scrutineering.

Seat belts (inc. lap-belts) must be fitted and worn by all occupants.

(No belt, no ride. This is for your own safety).

Once signed-on and scrutineered, you may continue to the parking area.

All loose items must be removed from the vehicle before going on the courses. Vehicles will be checked for these items and stickers.

15 mph site speed limit

No driving along the footpath at the bottom of the site, except at the designated crossing point for access to and from the Woodland Course.

All recoveries under the supervision, and at the discretion of a Marshal. All facets of winching operations may only be carried out by persons aged 18 and over, including rigging.

Pedestrians must not walk on the courses, only the access roads- this is for your own safety.

Children (under 16's) remain the sole responsibility of parents/carers at all times. Children must wear a Hi-Viz vest whilst outside a vehicle in all areas. Children must be accompanied by an adult in all active vehicle movement areas.

Dogs must be kept on leads and under proper control at all times.

It is the responsibility of the owner to clear up after your dog(s).

Do not drive roped-off areas.

Do not remove ropes or posts unless instructed by a Marshal.

Strictly no drinking and driving. No motorcycles or quad bikes.

No tractor, Implement or overly-aggressive treaded tyres.

Please take all your litter home with you.

The Marshal's decision is final

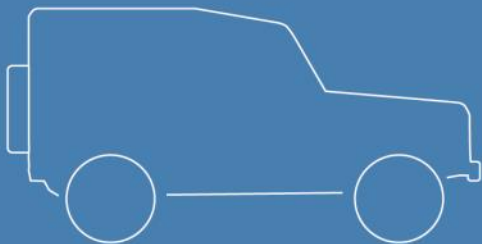
